Had to Show Him.

The East Oregonian tells of an amusing incident that occurred on the platform of the O. R. & N. depot at Pendleton. Small Pox Preventive.

Six bits worth of preventive is a whole lot better than 80 days in quarantine with loathsome small pox. Keep clean and take this.

Following is an old time remedy for smallpox: Sulphate of zinc, 1 gr.; solid ext. digitalis, 1 gr. Dissolve each in a teaspoonful of water; mix and add one teaspoonful of sugar; when thoroughly mixed add 4 ozs. water. Dose—One teaspoonful every hour for 12 hours. Children under ten years, one-half teaspoonful; infants, 10 drops. Vaccination will not take after this treatment is given.

Send your order to any druggist. Symptoms of all small pox (variola). Period of incubation 10 to 14 days. Mode of onset, sudden chill, high fever, headache, pain in loins. Eruption appears on 3d day, typical evolution about the 6th day or the 9th of the disease characteristic pustules fully formed. Eruption fades, desiccation at end of 2d week, crusts slowly separate leaving marked and enduring cicatrices. Danger of contagion so long as crusts reform indefinitely in families.

What has become of the cinabar discoveries which were recently made in the southern part of this county? 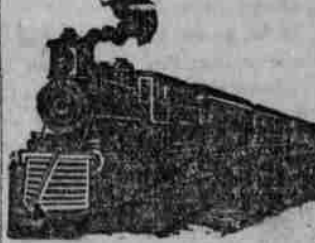
