Noting Small About Him.
There is on exhibition at the Oriental Shooting Gallery, 63 Third street, a veritable giant, whose height is 7 feet 10 1/2 inches and whose weight is 367 pounds. His name is Edward Beaupre, and he is a French-Canadian. He wears a No. 22 shoe, which has a length of 10 1/2 inches. This young Titan measures 28 1/2 inches across the back from shoulder to shoulder and 54 inches around the chest. His hands are each 11 inches long and when he stretches his arms he has a reach of 8 feet and 4 inches. Beaupre speaks both French and English. His massive head towers out of a 22 collar and is surmounted by a No. 19 hat. He has a little (?) brother, 11 years old, who is already 5 feet 4 inches high. Beaupre's parents are only of medium stature.

Beaupre is only 21 years old and within a year has added 1 1/2 inches to his height. He has been a cowboy near Glasgow, Mont., for a number of years. He was thrown from his horse, injuring his face he concluded to abandon the roundup. He can put his arms around a horse weighing 1000 pounds and lift the animal bodily from the ground. He has never attempted to develop his muscular ability, either. At night he has to sleep on the floor, because beds for his size do not exist generally.

In California there is a giantess, Ella Ewing by name, who is about Beaupre's size. He is on his way there to meet her. If they find each other agreeable, they may marry. It seems that some years ago an essentric French nobleman died, leaving to the city of Rouen, France, his entire fortune. He provided in his will that if two giants could be found whose height exceeded 7 feet (a man and a woman), and if these two should marry, the city of Rouen must annually pay the couple, during life, an annuity of 100,000 francs. Possibly Beaupre and Miss Ewing may become the beneficiaries of this provision.—Portland Journal.

The tourist travel between the east and the Pacific coast has reached enormous proportions in the last few years, and calls for a special class of equipment. To meet this demand the Pullman Co. has issued from its shops the Pullman Ordinary Sleepers. These cars appear similar to the regular sleeper, being built on the same plan, but not furnished with the same elegance. They are equipped with mattresses, blankets, sheets, pillows, pillow-cases, towels, combs, brushes, etc., requiring nothing else to be furnished by the passenger. Each car has a stove for making coffee and tea and doing light housekeeping, and each section can be fitted with an adjustable table. A uniformed porter accompanies each car, his business being to make up berths, keep the car clean, and look after the comfort and wants of the passengers. In each of the trains which are dispatched daily from Portland by the P. & N. Co., it is to be found one of these "Pullman Ordinary Sleepers." The car is attached to the "Chicago-Portland Special," which goes through to Chicago without change, and the one in the "Atlantic Express" runs to Kansas City without change. Passengers in this car for Chicago change to a similar car at Grinnon. Much of the first class travel is being carried in these cars, the rates being lower, and the service being nearly equal to that in the palace sleepers.
