

Boys Bound Over.

Brownsville, April 29.—William O. Tyer and Thomas Venum were bound over to the Circuit Court today to answer to a charge of robbing the bank of Brownsville yesterday of \$1700. Their bonds were placed at \$2000 each.

While the cashier of the Bank of Brownsville was at dinner yesterday some one entered the bank from the rear part and took \$1700 in gold. The robbery must have been committed between 12 and 12:30 P. M. No one saw anybody in the bank during that time, and the bank building stands in the center of the business part of town. The supposition is the person or persons that committed the robbery entered the woodshed of A. A. Tusing, which joins the brick building on the west, and entered the rear of the bank by way of a window. After gaining entrance it was an easy matter to get into the bank proper.

The cashier in going to dinner did not turn the combination on the safe, but simply locked it. The robber was evidently acquainted with the construction of the lock, and was prepared with a small piece of iron or steel which fitted into the lock and sprung it back. The two young men arrested, William O. Tyer and Thomas Venum, were both raised here, and both belong to good families. The evidence against them is not very strong. The young men are being defended by Russell Wyatt, of Albany. The prosecution is being conducted by Prosecuting Attorney J. N. Hart.
