Election Supplies.

Secretary of State Dunbar has forwarded to the clerks of the several counties election supplies to be used at the June election. The supplies consist of poll-books, tally sheets, statements, abstracts of votes, needles for stringing ballots, indelible pencils, receipt books for clerks and sheriffs, official seals and a copy of the election laws as revised by the last legislature.

An additional requirement exacted by the new law relates to the sealing of the ballot boxes of each precinct. Each election board will be supplied with an official seal, which, when the count of the ballots is completed, must be regularly signed by each member of the board making the count, and pasted over the opening of the ballot box to remain intact until time for making the official count.
