Graduating Address

Delivered by county school superintendent, William Bogeli, before the graduating class of the Prineville Public School 1902.

LADIES: It gives me pleasure in speaking to you, to congratulate you in having reached this stage in the course of your education.

The work of the public school is to prepare young people, that they may be of advantage to themselves and of usefulness to society; to prepare them for intelligent citizenship, and for the practical duties of every day life.

Some might be surprised that there are no boys among your number, but we often find this to be the case.

With many boys it is the bread and butter problem. They would like to continue in school but the conditions of life are such that this is almost impossible.

Others, when they reach the higher studies, feel that the study of some branches is but a waste of time. The parents often share the same view and it is then easy to leave school and take up what seems to them to be more practical pursuits.

Almost every young person wishes for an education. No one can question its advantages, but the great trouble with the young people is that they fail to realize its importance until it is too late. Some are always complaining because of a lack of opportunity, but every young person who has a willingness and a desire to climb higher intellectually will find a way open to them. To those who lack the determination to overcome obstacles, it matters little whether they secure an education or not, for the value of an education depends upon the person who has it.

While you are to be commended upon what you have done, you should feel that you are just beginning the culture of your intellects. I urge you to continue your studies in the higher branches for you owe to yourselves and to those around you to have a well stored mind. A young woman as well as a young man needs as broad a literary and scientific knowledge as possible. She should not stop short of a high school course. If you have not the opportunity of attending a high school, there are facilities offered by correspondence schools and by the abundance of good literature.

A noble christian woman has it in her power to exert a strong influence that helps to mold human life and you should bear in mind that your success in life depends more upon what you are than upon what you do. Society will be what women make it and the future destiny of the race is in her keeping. As young women, you are to be congratulated upon the future that opens out before you, for there never has been an age, or a country in which is such a career opened to women, as in this twentieth century, the grandest of all centuries, and in our country, the best of all countries.
