He has been a stock man, merchant and farmer, and has been a success in all of these occupations. He is a man of energy, integrity, and decision of character. 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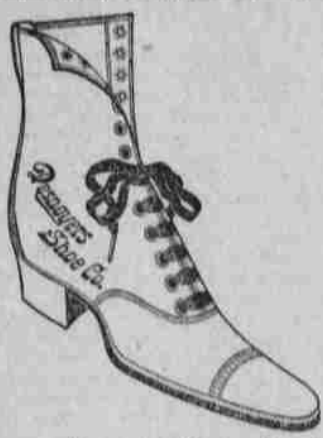
