The new passenger rate of 3 cents a mile on the Southern Pacific is distinctly a concession to Oregon. In California, north of Sacramento, the local passenger rates will remain 4 cents a mile, as they have been for years.

The Emancipation of Cuba, conceived and carried out under republican regime will stand as an enduring monument to the party and the bold and generous experiment in international history-making which elicits commendation for this country from the peoples of the world.

Chile has adopted a new liquor law that is attracting world-wide attention. Saloon licenses are sold ever three years to the highest bidder. Liquor cannot be sold within 200 yards of church, school, barracks, place of amusement or railway station, nor on trains; nor to minors; nor between the hours of midnight and 6 a. m. No one in any way interested in a liquor license is eligible to public office and every distillery has a government chemist to insure the purity of the product.

Sylvester Penoyer passed away at his home in Portland last Friday. He was one of the best known of Oregon's public men and one of the rugged pioneers who have made this country what it is. While his political career has been varied he has always lived up to his convictions and some of his bitterest political enemies were his warmest friends. He was a blunt outspoken man and did what he thought to be right no matter what the consequences.
