Because of the prompt action and generous aid of the United States, in the Martinique disaster on the Fourth of July the French Government at the banquet of the American Chamber of Commerce in Paris publicly decorated the President of the Chamber, Francis Kimbel, with the cross of the Legion of Honor, and he received at the same time the "accolade." This is the first time an American has received the "accolade," which is a double-barreled kiss on each cheek and an embrace. It was executed by the Minister of Foreign Affairs by order of the President of the French republic. At the same moment by preconcert all the principal hotels, the leading cafes, restaurants, shopping bazaars and public buildings blossomed out with American flags and the red, white and blue streamers.
