Oregon Farms.

Umatilla county has the largest area of improved land of Oregon's counties, according to the census its acreage of such lands being 352,763. Linn county stands second with 216,582 acres; Marion, third with 199,254 acres; Sherman, fourth with 198,285 acres, and Union fifth with 162,926 acres. In the value of farm lands, excepting buildings, Marion leads with \$10,186,780; Umatilla, second, \$9,201,870; Linn, third, \$7,516,800; Clackamas, fourth, \$6,664,350; Multnomah, fifth, \$6,642,400. In value of farm buildings Marion stands first at \$1,472,440; Linn, second, \$1,369,250; Clackamas, third, \$1,303,620; Umatilla, fourth, \$1,110,840; Lane, fifth, \$1,089,189. In number of farms Marion stands first with 2,754; Clackamas, second, 1,568; Linn third, 2,417. In value of products not fed to live stock, Umatilla stands first at \$1,536,755; Marion, second, \$1,299,055; Linn, third, \$1,753,243; Union, fourth, \$1,513,469; Lane, fifth, \$1,492,811. In value of live stock Malheur stands first at \$2,837,567; Harney, second, \$1,939,777; Umatilla third, \$1,919,897; Lake, fourth, \$1,766,154; Crook, fifth, \$1,642,391. Curry county had the smallest number of farms, 290. Lincoln county had the smallest acreage of improved farm land, 8,823.
