

Pay Your Taxes.

Under the new law for the collection of taxes, unpaid taxes become delinquent after the first Monday in October.

Section 19 of the new law treats with the delinquent roll, and prescribes when and in what manner it shall be made as follows:

"If any of the taxes mentioned in the roll shall remain unpaid, and the sheriff shall be unable to collect the same, he shall immediately after the first Monday of October extend the amount of the tax on each several parcel of real property, and upon the personal property assessed to each individual, in a column provided for such purposes on the tax roll, headed delinquent, and shall return such roll together with a statement compiled therefrom and entered thereon showing the total amount of taxes collected, the total amount of double assessments and other errors, etc."

Subsequent sections of the act provide that after the examination by the county clerk of the roll, and when the proper credits have been made for errors, etc., then the roll shall be returned to the sheriff with a warrant commanding him to sell the property upon which the tax was levied. So it will be seen that the county court has no voice in the matter.
