The Prineville people and community have organized an agriculture and stock association, and have already raised a sum of money to hold an exhibition of their productions Oct. 15 to 18, eliminating for their program housing, all of which is commendable. Crook county has great stock interests—fine blooded cattle and horses, and perhaps the best breeds of sheep for wool in the state or elsewhere. Its grain fields and alfalfa meadows are enlarging as artificial streams of water are brought upon them with transportation facilities pointing nearer its center. The county now is rapidly getting out of its isolated condition and frontier habits, taking on modern enterprises which are insured success from its field of many valuable resources, which are being developed. —Albany Herald.
