

**County Court Proceedings.**

The regular term of the commissioners court for September convened on Wednesday, September 3, County Judge Booth being absent. Commissioners Healy and Powell and clerk Smith and sheriff being present the following proceedings were had.

In the matter of the appointment of Justice of the peace for Newsom creek precinct, it was ordered that J. H. Kelly be appointed.

In the matter of the report of county surveyor on the C. E. McDowell road, report of C. A. Graves, county surveyor, read and approved.

In the matter of the appointment of Justice of the peace for Ireland precinct, ordered that Joseph Whitfield be and is hereby appointed justice of the peace for said precinct.

In the matter of the petition of George A. Stephens for a saloon license. Petition read and also remonstrance, but it appearing to the court that a majority of the legal voters of the precinct had signed the petition, it is therefore ordered that a license issue to said G. A. Stephens upon his filing a good and sufficient bond and paying into the county treasury the sum of \$200.

In the matter of error in the issuance of county warrants.
