

The Range War.

If not precisely the storm center of the range war, Heppner is near enough to it and has a sufficiently direct interest in it to share and reflect its passions.

It is a sort of three-cornered fight, in which the miners, the cattlemen and the sheepmen are mixed up, each, of course, for himself, but with a more or less close alliance between the miners and the cattlemen; and its declared aggressive purpose is to keep sheep off the Grant county mountain ranges.

As a matter of fact, the aggressors suffer no hazard in this fierce enterprise, for sentiment in Grant county is almost wholly at their back, and if a criminal charge growing out of the war should be brought into court there could be no conviction.

Within the past few years a radical change has taken place in the conditions affecting the range stock industry in Eastern Oregon.

Formerly, the whole hazard of the business was in the winter season, when thousands of animals almost every year froze or starved to death on the open range, there being little or no preparation for winter feeding.
