California Timber King.

ASHLAND Oct. 7.—Thomas B. Walker, late of Minneapolis, is now the timber king of Northern California, owning more timber lands than any other single individual. And he is constantly adding to his possessions. For over a year past he has been buying all the timber land in Shasta and adjacent counties that answered his purpose, and at the present time has a clear title to 53,874 acres—almost ninety square miles of valuable timber in Shasta county alone. He is assessed on the rolls at \$170,850, or at the rate of \$3 per acre.
