The board of directors of the olumbia Southern Extension railroad company has approved the maps of the last section of the proosed extension from Shaniko to iend, a distance of a trifle more han ninety-seven miles. These mps will now go to the United tates land office at The Dalles r filing, in order that the commany may have right of way across government land. It is notable, however, that the southernmost twentyseven miles of the route will cross very little government land. Prospects of irrigation in that country, together with the promise of the railroad, has had the effect of putting most of the government land into private lands.

Everything is now ready for the financing of this project and for construction: President Lytle expects to have all arangements made for construction crews on the line early in the spring. The grades are very light, and the curvature is not great. For most of the distance the line does not vary perceptibly from dead level. From Shaniko it bears southeasterly to Trout creek, from which point the main line climbs the divide between Hay creek and Willow Basin crossing Agency Plains and going through the Haystack country. The crossing of the Grooked river is a dozen miles below Prineville. From that point to Bend there is little curvature or grade in the line.-Chronicle.


