

Up Deschutes Valley.

The board of directors of the Columbia Southern Extension railroad company has approved the maps of the last section of the proposed extension from Shaniko to Bend, a distance of a trifle more than ninety-seven miles.

Everything is now ready for the financing of this project and for construction. President Lytle expects to have all arrangements made for construction crews on the line early in the spring.

Interesting Features of Southwestern Oregon.

From recent reports of A. B. Searle, who is in charge of the topographic work of the United States Geological Survey in southwestern Oregon near Glendale, interesting details with regard to the country and difficulties encountered in the Government mapping of the region are drawn.

The method used in mapping the section was to locate as many prominent points as possible by triangulation, which were then used to control the measurements by road traverse.

Swamp Disease Kills Cattle.

Dr. Mesner, stock inspector for Jackson county, received the following letter Friday from W. P. Counts, a prominent stockman of Tolo: "We have lost a number of calves which were brought from Crescent City. Upon examining one, a small bunch of fine white worms about the size of a horse hair and from one half to three-

fourths of an inch in length were found just beneath the valve at the top of the windpipe. Would this cause death, and what treatment would you advise? The calves cough and breathe with a wheezing sound, but eat until nearly the last. The lungs look perfectly healthy."

Last Saturday Dr. Mesner went down to Mr. Count's ranch to investigate the trouble. On making a post-mortem examination he found that the animals had died from the effects of hush, or wormus bronchitis, a disease caused by a very small worm produced by a germ developed in stagnant water.

Mr. Counts has 200 head of young stock which he bought on the coast near Crescent City, and of this number 60 head had died at the time of Dr. Mesner's visit. The cattle had contracted the disease while feeding on the marshes in the district where they were raised.—Telegram.
