The experiments of the Massachuset State Board of Health have shown that aeration has little or no effect upon the condition of organic matter in water-that is, the organic matter is not assisted in its oxidation by agitation in the air. It was also found that the highest degree of activity in oxidation process is to be found in quiescent or stagment waters. It then became clear that self-purification in a sluggish stream is far more effective than a swift current, and that dams and other impediments have a beneficial effect upon the condition of water in river chan-




