

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

In the matter of supervisor for Road District Number 8, of Hay creek George Lytle was appointed by the court and was notified of the appointment on June 6th.

Henry Cross was appointed to serve in the same capacity for Road District Number 13, of Johnson creek and was notified of his appointment on June 6th. These appointments were made at a special session held on June 3rd, for that purpose.

J. H. Thomas' remonstrance against the bridge across the Deschutes of the Warm Springs agency was not acted upon.

The report of the viewers of the J. H. Horney road was read and voted, and was then referred to W. A. Bell, who is empowered to act for the petitioning attorney, in such matters.

The warrant numbered 675, which was drawn in favor of E. T. Monroe for \$625, was drawn in duplicate and was ordered cancelled by the clerk. This was done on July 3rd.

The resignation of J. L. Allen as supervisor of Road District Number 8 was accepted at the June term and George Lytle was appointed to act in the same capacity.

The petition for a Deschutes bridge sent in by the Indians, was not acted upon by the court.

Acting on Arthur Hodges' report of the examination made of the account of the sheriff, the check was ordered to balance all accounts with W. C. Congleton, ex-sheriff, in accordance with the report of Arthur Hodges.

The receipts for the amount expended on the H. W. Lawson road was filed on June 2nd, and was continued awaiting proof of the opening of the road.

The remonstrance to the change in the county road, which was petitioned by C. J. Cotton, et al., was withdrawn by H. W. Reed, who appeared as a special attorney for the petitioners in the remonstrance.

On J. Cotton, et al. in their petition for a change in the county road, were sustained, and the Board ordered viewers and surveyors to commence the road according to the petition.

A. W. Pope, et al. in their remonstrance to the change in the county road, which was petitioned by C. J. Cotton, et al., was withdrawn by H. W. Reed, who appeared as special attorney for the petitioners in the remonstrance.

In the A. B. Esthens' petition for a saloon for Ashwood precinct, was refused for the present, owing to an error in the proof of publication.

The petition of H. K. Nissen, et al. for a county road was refused consideration by court for the reason that the bondsmen and petitioners have refused to pay the costs on report of the viewers on a road over the same route. This was in regard to a former petition for a road over the same route. The bondsmen reconsidered and paid cash on the first petition and the petitioners having filed a new bond, which was approved on the 2nd. day of July. It was ordered that the board of county viewers proceed to lay out and survey said proposed road according to the petition. They were ordered to meet at the place of beginning as mentioned in the petition, on the 27th day of July, 1903, and were notified of this order on the 8th day of July, 1903.

In remitting the apportionment to Road Supervisor W. J. Schmidt, the clerk was ordered to draw a warrant in favor of W. J. Schmidt for \$75.00, this being the amount of District Number 165 apportionment. The warrant number 687, was drawn July 3rd.

The court appointed two county road viewers G. Springer and J. W. Elliott, and the clerk was ordered to notify them at once of their appointment. They are to serve until January 1st, 1904.

The report of the appraisers in the W. T. Casey's case was approved and the clerk was ordered to draw a warrant for Mr. Casey for \$100.00. The records were submitted to W. A. Bell, Deputy District Attorney, and he reported in open court that the same was all correct. The road is ordered established open, and recorded according to law.

The W. J. Creswell et al. petition for bridge on the Deschutes river was continued.

In the notice of presenting bills for the court to act upon, it was ordered that all bills should be filed by 5 o'clock in the day preceding the first day of the commissioners' court. They should be filed with the county clerk.

A phone was ordered to be placed in the office of the county judge.
