Circular Letter No. 11.

Salem, Oregon, July 16, 1903.

To County Superintendents.

Gentlemen:

Examinations for state papers will be held in each county on August 12, 13, 14 and 15th; for county papers on August 13, 14 and 15th.

Each superintendent will determine the place of holding such examinations in his respective county. I would suggest, however, that the place most convenient for the greatest number of applicants be selected.

The package containing the questions will be marked with an "X" which will enable you to comply with Rule XVIII. Rules XVIII, XIX, XX, XXI and XXII should be carefully explained to applicants, as they will be rigidly adhered to by this department.

The distinguishing mark for your county will be "R", which is to be placed by the applicant, as an exponent to his examination number.

Place the applicant's preliminary paper in a separate envelope, seal it, place the name of the county only upon the envelope and send it with the unmarked manuscript to this office.

It would be well to keep a memorandum of the papers sent, and carefully compare said memoranda with the receipt returned from this office, and if they do not agree, notify this office at once.

The law requires that I shall deposit the full amount of fees for state papers with the state treasurer, hence, the applicant must pay for the exchange when remitting fee. No manuscripts will be graded until the fee is received here.

Notice of the examination must be given through the press at least ten days before the examination.

The following form is recommended:

Teacher's Examination.
