

Notice is hereby given, that the County Court of Crook County, Oregon will receive sealed bids up to November 30, 1903 at 2 o'clock P. M. for the building of a wagon road up Hay Creek Canyon in said county and State as follows:—

1st. A bid for the construction of a wagon road up said canyon commencing at C. McPherson's mail box on county road near the Northeast corner of Section 18 Tp 10 S R 45 W. M. and ending and intersecting the county road at the Pierce place in Section 23 Tp 10 S R 45 E. W. M. as per stakes set.

2nd. A bid for the construction of said road from the above starting point as per said stakes up to the South bank of Crisp Creek in Section 29 Tp 10 S R 45 E. W. M.

3rd. A bid for the construction of said road from the South bank of said Crisp creek to the intersection of the County road at the said Pierce place, as per said stakes.

That in all and any of the above bids, the bidder must state the width of the road, maximum grade, distance apart of turnouts, and width and length of same on grades, and width of grades, time to complete same, and terms of payment, and successful bidder shall within 10 days after awarding of contract furnish a bond equal to the contract prior to be approved by the Court, together with a contract and specifications of the work to be done.

Said bids shall also specify whether bridges are included or not. County will furnish what graders and scrapers as it may have to spare. Bids should be addressed to the County Clerk and marked "Bids" Hay Creek Canyon Road." The court reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
