1st.
A bid for the construction of a wagon road up said canyon commencing at C. McPherson's mill box on county road near the Northeast corner of Section 18 Tp 10 S R 15 E W M, and ending and intersecting the county road at the Pierce place in Section 32 Tp 10 S R 15 E W M, as per stakes set.
2nd.
A bid for the construction of said road from the above starting point as per said stakes up to the South bank of Crisp Creek in Section 29 Tp 10 S R 15 E W M.
3rd.
A bid for the construction of said road from the South bank of said Crisp creek to the intersection of the County road at the said Pierce place, as per said stakes.


