## Socialist Column

THIS COUNTRY is made up of working people, both industrial and agricultural, but is ruled by the capitalist class, which is numerically small. Being in control of the government, it runs the government in the interests of its class and against the interests of the working class, which is the people. We Socialists believe that the country should be ruled by the people in the interests of the people. That is why we established a government in the first place. We want the people to own it so that the political power can be used to begin the march to the co-operative system, called Social Democracy. All the means of existence are now owned by capitalists, and yet the capitalists' class makes up only about 12 per cent of the population, and a mere ONE PER CENT of it OWNS OVER HALF THE WEALTH OF THE NATION! The means of existence should be owned by the collectivity in order that the benefits should go to ALL instead of to a FEW.

Under the capitalist system the vast majority of mankind must sell themselves to the capitalistic owners of the means of production and distribution in order to live—and to live miserably at that.

The nation owns the post office and everybody is glad that it does. It ought to own all the trusts so that all may enjoy the benefits.

It ought to own all the means of production as soon as such industries have become sufficiently concentrated.

To bring this about the people—the workers—must get control of the political power. The Social-

Democratic party (known as the Socialist party in some states, and nationally) is organized to bring this about—this and the abolition of capitalism. It insists that the industrious class shall be the wealthy class, and the idle class the poor class—but it will, in fact, abolish the poor class altogether. The Social-Democratic movement is international, but we expect it to achieve success in the United States first, because the capitalist system, which we mean to uproot, is best developed here. To show you that your interests lie with us we print the following:

### Program of International Social-Democracy:

1. Collective ownership of all industries in the hands of Trusts and Combines, and of all public utilities.
2. Democratic management of such collective industries and utilities.
3. Reduction of the hours of labor and progressively increased Remuneration.
4. State and National Insurance for the workers and honorable rest for old age.
5. The Inauguration of public Industries to safeguard the workers against lack of employment.
6. Education of ALL children up to the age of 18 years. No child labor.
7. Equal political and civil rights for men and women.

### Doesn't Believe in Equal Suffrage.

We know there is a certain type of thought among women which advocates a revolution in social economics and which preaches the doctrine of woman taking up the work of man and reversing the present order of things, but if you will investigate the facts you will find that the very women harboring this thought are failures as housekeepers and home-makers, are driving men to drink and divorce on cold vitals and "free thought" literature, and through their indifference and infidelity to their home duties and real mission are sowing the seeds of home anarchy and disorder which means the final overthrow of free government. And you will notice too, that the very men who are clamoring so loudly for the rights of woman are the very men who make practical slaves out of their wives and that the very women who are so insistent upon woman being "liberated" and "freed" from something—they don't know what—are the very specimens that make hen-pecked husbands.

No—the old way is the true way, and the true way is the old way. Men are and should be first husbands and fathers, and as such and in their essential nature, they are builders of homes and states and institutions, world conquerors and masters. Women are and should be first wives and mothers and as such and in their essential nature, they are conservers and preservers of homes, states and institutions, masters and conquerors of the world's masters and conquerors. Let all idle debate and controversy cease. A youthful son should not debate with his gray haired mother the superiority of the one over the other. That gentle, tender touch of a mother's hand has no counterpart in the universe and that strong and sinewy arm of the manson never matches strength with "tendons blue-veined and fair."
