NOTICE OF WATER APPROPRIATION.

Notice of appropriation of water by the United States as filed in the office of the State Engineer at Salem, Oregon, on April 16, 1906, 829 a. m.

"In pursuance of the authority transferred upon me October 6, 1905, by the Secretary of the Interior, under the provision of the Act of Congress approved June 17, 1902, (32 Stat. 388) known as the Reclamation Act, and in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon, I hereby notify you that it is the intention of the United States to utilize all the surplus and unappropriated waters of the Deschutes River and tributaries for development of power below the mouth of Warm Springs River, situated in T. 8 S., R. 14 E., W. M. 1; that it is the intention of the United States to use said power for pumping water to the arid lands bordering on and in the vicinity of the Columbia River, and for other purposes as authorized by said Act of Congress, and request that such waters be withdrawn from appropriation except for purposes of irrigation, as provided in the laws of this state. This notice is given by David C. Henny, Supervising Engineer, U. S. Reclamation Service, thereto duly authorized by the Secretary of the Interior.
