The exhibit need not be extensive but every progressive teacher and school should see to it that the quality of the work does them justice.

I realize that the time is too short to prepare an extensive exhibit but compositions, language exercises, number work and arithmetical analyses are matters of every day school work and a little extra care in preparation of written work on the part of the pupil, a little trouble in sorting and forwarding on the part of the teacher and the exhibit is prepared.

This is the first time school work has been allowed a place on the premium lists in Crook County fairs, and as the fair comes soon after schools begin, we will have some difficulty in preparing an exhibit; but let us strive to come up with our part of the work, secure a permanent place on the premium lists and arouse a deeper interest in school work and school affairs.

Teachers—Patrons will look for your name on the exhibit and its appearance will call attention to yourself and inquiries will be made concerning your work. Should your school be in session, its non-appearance may be taken as an admission that your work is not what it should be and you are unwilling to submit it to the public for inspection.

Pupils—your parents and friends will look for your name on the exhibit and will be disappointed if they do not find it there with the others and the public will naturally conclude that your work is not good or you haven't any pride or ambition.

Teachers and Pupils—Here is

an opportunity to interest fathers, mothers, patrons and friends in your school work; here is an opportunity to prove to the people of the county and to the strangers in our midst, who may be looking for locations and who will spread the facts abroad, that we are alive, that we have good schools, wide awake, progressive teachers and intelligent hard-working pupils.

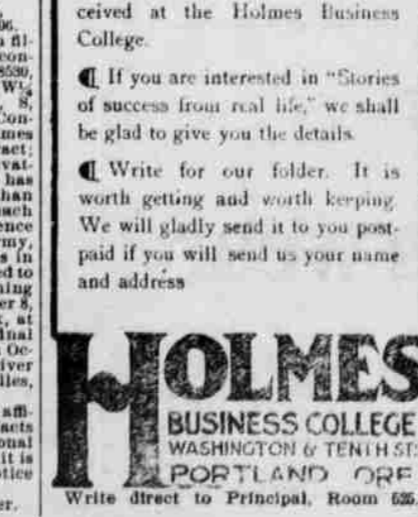
