Reserve Allotments Satisfactory.

For almost two weeks past the meeting of stockmen of the eastern division of the Blue Mountain Forest Reserve has held the boards in Sumpter. Although the meeting was scheduled for its commencement on November 8, many stockmen reached here earlier, and work was started immediately upon their arrival.

Committees had been appointed representing sheep and cattle men for the purpose of arranging a settlement among themselves as to what territory would be applied for from the reserve for grazing. Those who expected that the range warfare heretofore existing would be brought into this meeting were disappointed, as nothing occurred during the whole convention to mar the proceedings, which have proven satisfactory to almost all concerned.

It is considered that this meeting has done more to settle the bitter feuds that have disgraced Grant and Western Baker than all the legislative enactments of past years. Stockmen left here with a clear understanding as to their rights, and there is small prospect that the killing of sheep and cattle will continue among those who will occupy the ranges of the forest reserve.

The convention really had the appearance of a legislative assembly when over 200 interested men congregated daily and nightly in the Hotel Sumpter to discuss the Summer range problem on the reserve. D. B. Sheller and his corps of assistants worked indefatigably to make allotments that would meet with the indorsement of the stockmen. That they were successful in this respect is shown when it can be said scarcely a man went away feeling that he had been unjustly treated.

Oregon, Washington and Idaho were well represented in the gathering. Most of those coming from the two last named states came from Walla Walla and Boise. Men whose property valuations represented sums ranging from \$10,000 to almost \$1,000,000 were present, some of them being the greatest representatives of wealth of the Northwest.

Toward the close of the convention Mr. Sheller was assisted by Chief of the Forest Reserve A.

F. Potter, of Washington, D. C. He and Mr. Sheller left for the John Day section, where they will inspect the condition of that part of the reserve.

There was no mail from the west Friday. The omission was caused by unusually heavy rains west of the Cascades. The Puget Sound country was visited by the most disastrous floods in the history of the country. Two hundred square miles of territory are under water and hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of property destroyed.

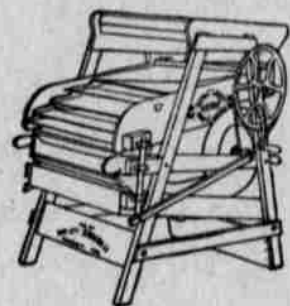
