Wouldn't that jar you? Two new counties out of old Crook. If you don't watch out there will not be a knob left big enough to hang your hat on.

The legislature of the State of Oregon is now in session. E. W. Haines of Washington, was elected president of the senate and Frank Davey speaker of the house.

J. M. Lawrence, receiver of the United States land office at Roseburg, is lobbying at Salem for the new county, instead of attending to his duties at his place of business. Wonder what Uncle Sam pays him for?

When Mr. Drake gets back from Salem it would be well for him to settle definitely his eastern boundary. If he wants the line to run to the old bed of Crooked river then Perry Poindexter, Mr. Johnson and others living in Western Prineville will have to go to Bend to transact county business. Get busy, you people.

Crook county's apportionment of the United States 5 per cent road fund was \$1889.90. This amount was based upon a total of 5,122,560 acres for the county. There are just two counties in the state with a larger acreage—Harney with 6,780,160, and Malheur with 6,277,440.

Quite a number of frost bites are reported by the doctors. Among the worst were the cases of Gilbert Lawson from the Upper Ochoco and that of Will Slaven. Lawson's ears are in bad shape and Slaven had his hands frozen.

A couple of men who left for Shaniko by private conveyance had quite a time of it at the head of Cow canyon. Early Monday morning they ran into a blizzard and lost the road. By the aid of a pocket compass they got their bearings and arrived in safety at their destination.

W. W. Brown, the sheep king of Eastern Oregon, was in town last week en route to his home at Paulina, from a business trip to Portland. Mr. Brown in talking over stock conditions in general said that he considered cattle about the best investment of any at the present market prices of stock.

Mrs. Julia T. Lindborg died this morning from a lingering attack of consumption. She came to this country in search of health but failed to get relief. Mr. Lindborg arrived from Portland yesterday and was at the bedside of his wife when she died. Mrs. Lindborg was 41 years of age. She has two sons, one attending the Crook County High School and the other a lad of 6 years. Her remains will be taken to Portland for burial.

A MISLEADING CIRCULAR

A Sample of the Lies that are Being Spread Over the West Side.

Drake and his stool-pigeons at Bend are sending out the following circular with the avowed intention of misleading the people of Western Crook. The new court house will not cost the county when completed \$75,000. The contract price to the taxpayers is \$42,191. Another lie is the statement made that not a penny was spent upon the roads of Western Crook. Everybody knows that every cent raised in a road district is spent in that district. The evident purpose of the circular is so patent that instead of making friends for Drake and the Bend townsites it will react in favor of letting well enough alone. Our county taxes are only 15 mills, and that too, when nearly a double assessment must be raised to meet a deficit in the state revenue. Don't be hoodwinked by Drake and his satellites. Think for yourself and it will not take you long to turn down his little game. The circular reads:

CITIZENS

On Saturday last the county court signed a contract for the construction of the foundation of a \$50,000 courthouse, "the building to be completed when funds are available." With furnishings and incidentals it will cost the county \$75,000 before it is finished. This building is to be erected despite the fact that a big majority of the taxpayers of the county have, in writing, protested against such action. A representative of these protestants was at Saturday's meeting and when, in their name he objected to this high handed proceeding, he was in effect informed that the expressed wish of the county's taxpayers was not a matter worthy of consideration.

Do you know that though the 1907 tax rate for county purposes has been lowered, the General Fund for the coming year will be

\$21,000

Greater than it was a year ago that through the trick of raising assessments in Western Crook without corresponding raises elsewhere, we are the ones who will foot the bills for this extravagance, which is being put through against the express wishes of the majority?

Do you know that the total amount raised by the county for all purposes in 1901 was \$17,178.45; that a year ago the amount raised for roads alone was \$17,978.12; and that of this last amount, greater than the total county expenses five years ago, not one penny was put upon the roads in Western Crook—the section from which a big proportion of it came?

How Long Shall We Weekly Submit to Being Bled?

Not one month longer, if our people will unite against graft and in favor of good, economical, progressive and honest government of our home affairs. Western Crook today contains over two-thirds of the county's population and over three-fifths of its assessed property.

If you are interested in the movement to end, once and for all, the process of milking our portion of the county for the glorification of other sections, and to establish home administration of our own affairs, where in we shall get something for the money paid out in taxes, attend the mass meeting at Bend Wednesday night, Laidlaw Thursday night, Sisters Friday night, Redmond Saturday night or Powell Buttes (Sheppard) school house Monday night.
