

**BIG EVENTS CROWD EACH OTHER**

Portland, Oregon, Aug. 12th, 1907.  
 Editor Journal—The Oregon Development League continues to gain new members. The last organizations to enter the Oregon family group are the Deschutes Valley Development League, of Redmond, and the Woodburn Commercial Club.

Medford occupied the center of the stage last week with a fruit carnival and the annual meeting of the State Horticultural Society. The attendance was large.

Portland expects to entertain ten thousand visitors from different parts of the state on the occasion of the visit of Secretary Taft September 6th. A rate of a fare and a third from Roseburg and points north, and from Pendleton and points west, has been made for this occasion.

Mr. Albert Phenis, staff correspondent of the Manufacturers' Record, of Baltimore, Maryland, will spend this week in Oregon.

A. Bennett, of Irrigacion, and Judge Geo. T. Baldwin, of Klamath Falls, Vice-President of the Oregon Development League, have agreed upon a special state badge, for all delegates to the National Irrigation Congress at Sacramento, Sept. 27. The word OREGON and the beaver are prominent features of the badge. The committee have instructed Tom Richardson, Secretary of the League to receive seventy-five cents each from delegates desiring to wear this badge.

People all over the state are hungry for more details of the colonist rates. Letters are arriving from all sections of the state, asking for exact rates from different points throughout the United States to Oregon. From Kansas City and other Missouri river points, St. Paul, Duluth, and Winnipeg, the rate is \$25, from Oklahoma City and St. Louis \$30 Chicago \$33, Buffalo \$42.50, Cincinnati and Louisville \$38., Des Moines \$29., Indianapolis \$35.85, Boston \$49.90, New York \$50., Pittsburgh \$42., Memphis \$37.50, Birmingham Alabama, \$44.50. Each ticket is \$2.50 less when bought to points east of Umatilla. The rates given above covers almost the entire country, and are the same proportionately from all smaller stations.

**Coal in Oregon in 1906.**

The only productive coal field in Oregon is situated in the southwestern part of the state, in Coos county, and is known as the Coos Bay field, from the fact that it entirely surrounds that body of water. It occupies a total area of about 250 square miles, its length north and south being about 30 miles and its maximum breadth at the middle about 11 miles, from which it tapers regularly toward both ends.

Other coal fields have been prospected in different parts of the state, and some of them contain coal of fairly good quality. Among these are the upper Nehalem field, in Columbia county; the lower Nehalem field, in Clatsop and Tillamook counties; the Yaquina field, in Lincoln county, and the Eckley and Shasta costal fields, in Curry county. All of these fields lie west of the Cascade range, but none has been developed to the point of production. Another field has been located in the basin of John Day river, east of the Cascade range, but little is known concerning it. All of the fields west of the range, with the exception of the Coos Bay, are of small area, the largest outside of the Coos Bay being the upper Nehalem, which has an area of less than 20 miles. The coal of all these fields is lignitic in character.

Coal mining in Oregon during the last two years has been adversely affected by the great increase in the production of petroleum in California and its use as fuel. All of the product from Coos Bay has been shipped by water, principally to San Francisco. The increased use of fuel oil in that city has decreased the consumption of coal to a marked degree, and the effect upon Oregon's production is shown in a decrease from 109,641 short tons in 1905 to 70,731 tons in 1906, a loss of 29,910 tons, or 27.3 per cent. The value declined \$70,257, or 24.8 per cent, from \$282,459 in 1905 to \$212,202 in 1906.

Coal was first noted in the Coos Bay region about fifty years ago, Prof. J. S. Newberry having reported in 1855 that the coal deposit of

Coos Bay had begun to attract attention. Some mining was done there in 1855 and 1872, and in 1876 two mines, the Eastport and the Newport, were in active operation. The Newport, however, is the only one surviving. The Beaver Hill mine, opened in 1905, was at first a rather uncertain factor, but is now an important producer. The census of 1880 reports the total coal production of Oregon at 43,205 tons, this being the earliest record of production in the state. The total production was 100,000 tons in 3 years only—1896, 1897, 1904, and 1905—the maximum being obtained in 1904, when it reached 111,540 tons.

An advance chapter from "Mineral Resources of the United States, Calendar Year 1906," on the production of coal in 1906, by E. W. Parker, will be ready for distribution in September.
