

WILL TAKE A RELIGIOUS CENSUS

On next Saturday afternoon, every house in Prineville and the immediate vicinity will be visited and every man, woman and child, if possible, will be counted and classified according to his or her own wish. The principal objects to be accomplished are: to ascertain the church preference of each family or individual, if they attend church and Sunday School and if not to give a cordial invitation to attend the church and Sunday School of his or her choice. To accomplish this the cordial co-operation of all the people is earnestly requested.

The movement is inaugurated by the pastors and Sunday School superintendents of the city who for convenience, divided the city into five districts with a chairman for each. Each district will be divided into three sections with two visitors for each section. It is calculated that each pair going together will cover all the territory in one afternoon. The chairmen and visitors will meet at the Union church promptly at 1 o'clock when the visitors will be assigned to their sections and instructed for their work.

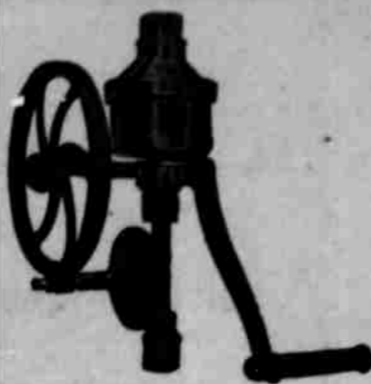
