The fair board will erect and maintain all necessary stalls on the grounds for the accommodation of racing stock and will assist in the maintenance of the track.

The pavilion has just been painted and work will be done on the grounds at once for the coming fair. The date will be decided upon as soon as other fairs in adjoining counties can be heard from.

Premium lists will be out in the early spring and the 1908 fair should exceed all previous ones.
