Believed That Voting Strength Will Reach the 2300 Mark at Election in June

-507 More Republicans Than Democrats Registered in Crock County

The registration of voters for the primaries to be held tomorrow is completed. The totals show an increase of sixty-eight over the registration for the primaries in 1906, and more than 450 over the registration four years ago.

Thirty precincts are on the clerk's list this year, the new one being Lyle Gap. The republican majority shows a slight increase over that of two years ago, the present plurality over the democrats reaching 507 as compared Lytle of California, William Lytle, with 467 in 1906.
