Calvin was indicted by the federal grand jury for sending obscene matter through the mail. Owing to the circumstances of the case and upon the recommendation of the district attorney, Judge Wolverton let Calvin off without a jail sentence when he pleaded guitty in the United States court.

But in spite of all the fascinations of a great city, Morris slept in a cell at the county jail last night. And his dreams weren't of music and dances and beautifully gowned women and the buzz of automobiles. But instead his fancies were far away in his old home country in Crook county. and the dreams were of green valleys and mountains and cattle and horses and of the people he


