After the seed has soaked the desired length of time the sack may be suspended above the barrel on a couple of sticks and the solution allowed to drain back. This treatment of the seed should be given a short time before planting. Sufficient time should elapse, however, so that the seed may dry. Potatoes treated in the above manner and planted on what is known as clean ground-clover sod breaking or land that has not raised potatoes for a year or two-will pro duce an absolutely scab free crop. 
