over the recent decision of the Ore- inclusive. gon supreme court in regard to Road fun water and waterpower rights, a fearing that they might be I entirely without water, the ripari landowners along the Deschut river, in this section, have sent petition to their legislators Salem, asking them to use the influence in securing a provision in the proposed new water coe which will leave them their veste right in, and to, sufficient water for stock and domestic purpose including light, heat, lawns as gardens, irrigation, etc.

They have also written to State Engineer Lewis as follows:

"Knowing that yourself and others are drafting a new irriga- Of the financial condition of the Cou tion bill, and appreciating the sense of justice and fair play which has always been shown in your dealings with the people of this sections, we take the liberty of asking you in behalf of the many riparian owners along the Deschutes, to incorporate in the new bill a measure which will insure the riparian owners enough water to furnish power and light for the home and for the irrigation of the garden and lawn, and water

for stock. "Many of us took homesteads along the banks of this stream with the sole purpose and intention of using the water for the generation of power and light for domestic use thereby creating homes with all the advantages of the city. We all realize that the greater portion of the water of this river must be used for irrigation and it is right that it should be so, but at the same time we think it only just and equitable that the riparian owners should be insured the right to a small portion for their home use."
