High School Students Study "Fire Blight"

The curriculum of the Crook County High School has been constantly and rapidly expanding and each year the courses are placed upon a more practical basis. At the beginning of the second semester of your present school year a class in agriculture was organized under Professor Blanchard. In their study of diseases common to fruit trees they found what is known as the "fire blight" of apple and pear trees. This disease is very destructive if not handled properly. The blight may be recognized by the blackened limbs and withered leaves which remain on the diseased twigs all winter. Often the blighted and healthy part of the tree is sharply separated.

The fire blight is caused by bacteria which steal the nourishment from the cambium, or the growing part of the tree, between the bark and the wood. In order to destroy the blight the affected part of the tree must be cut off about one foot below the blackened portion, and all of the brush must be burned to kill the germs. Light pruning or neglecting to burn the brush may cause the disease to spread. If the pruning knife or saw cuts into the wood containing the germs, it should be dipped in a solution of carbolic acid lest the bacteria be transplanted into the healthy part of the tree.

An orchard should be watched and carefully pruned at the first appearance of the fire blight. Upon observation the agricultural class of the high school discovered that the fire blight had obtained a strong hold on an orchard or two near Prineville and that the owners were unaware of the contagiousness of the disease, hence pruning has not been sufficient to destroy it.

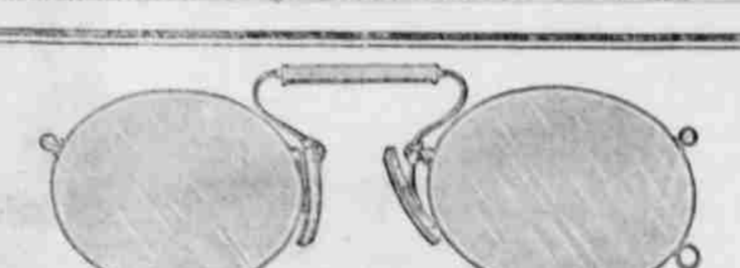
