The committee of the council on streets and public Improvements was ordered to see that this walk was built according to grade, but as a matter of fact there is no established grade for Prineville, streets or sidewalks, in that part of town, if there is in any part of the town at all. This remonstrance represents property owners who will have to pay for this improvement, while the petition for the sidewalk does not show that any one of the petitioners will have to spend one cent for the construction of this improvement. There is absolutely no record in this office nor before the council which shows it that sidewalk is to built in the city limits, or that it is under their jurisdiction. There W. P.
