COUNTY COURT.

Petition for county road by J. W. Brown et al. Upon petition, due public notice and bond for \$300 with J. W. Brown and F. E. Dayton as sureties being duly filed, and this cause having been continued from the January, 1910 term hereof, it is ordered that the viewers meet at the beginning of said road on April 18, 1910, view, review and survey out the same and report thereon at the next term hereof.

In the matter of the application of Anna Maling for reduction of taxes. Complaint is heard in open court and in the absence of any authority in law, by statute or otherwise, the complaint is dismissed.

Upon the application of Mathias J. Klein et ux and the Lytle Townsite Company, owners of the fee of the proposed town of Riverside, and it appearing to the court that the plat and tracing thereof, together with the dedication of the streets and alleys to the public without reservation, have been properly filed and have been approved by the county surveyor and county assessor and that all of the requirements of law have been complied with, it is ordered that said plat be approved and spread of record.

Upon sworn petition asking to correct clerical error in plat of the townsite of Kenwood, the prayer of said petition is allowed.

Upon application of A. W. Boyce et ux owners of the fee of the proposed townsite of the Boyce addition to Madras. It appearing to the court that the plat and tracing thereof, together with the dedication of the streets, etc., to the public without reservation has been properly filed, and that the same has been approved by the county surveyor and county assessor, and it appearing that all the requirements of law have been complied with, it is ordered that said plat be approved and ordered spread of record.
