ed for commencement of work it was impossible to get the necessary information. The result was that the first contract called for the de-

livery of an impossible quantity of water from the normal flow of the stream, and to add to this difficulty money was expended without due care and business guidance. This company failed and went into the hands of a receiver. Other interests appeared on the

scene and offered to take the enterprise over if a higher acreage charge were permitted, so as to impound the flood waters of the Tumalo for use during the season when the stream's normal flow was wholly inadequate. To see that this work was done on the terms

agreed, the Desert Land Board required the new company to put up a \$40,000 bond, in the event of signing a final agreement with the state, deeming this amount sufficient to guarantee performance of all obligations, as it was a sum made available over and above the heavy expenditures the company would have to make in building the reservoir and opening the canals. Should the present settlers insist upon continuing under their old contract, the new management will make arrangements to have them receive their percentage of the normal flow of the stream during the irrigation season, which will be apportioned on the unit basis of 27,000 irrigable acres, the size of the original project, and all taking land from now on will have to come in under the new agreement, thus getting a share of the conserved waters.

Manager Hendryx returned from the property, and says that the company has finished purchase of the reservoir site, has its topographic surveys well advanced, and will be ready on schedule time to appear before the Desert Land Board for the final agreement. The expenditure being made indicates that the new company is committed to the work. Borings will have to be made on the reservoir site and exhaustive data furnished, to enable the state engineer to say whether the plans are feasible. If all is acceptable on the terms already outlined, the Oregon, Washington & Idaho Finance company will be ready early in the summer to begin heavy construction. A diversion headgate is to be made on the Tumalo, about five miles further down the stream than the present headgate, to save heavy loss of water in the canal. The reservoir site, which is a natural lake basin,

will be connected with the present distribution canal. Estimates convince the management that the full area involved under the present project, 42,000 acres, can be watered by the stored waters of the stream.
