member of the board be selected to confer with this committee for the

purpose of having its work harmonious with the policy of the board, as regards expenditures and other important details. The committee as appointed by the chair are, Hugh Lakin, Oliver Adams and R. E. Gray, with R. L. Jordan as advisor.

It was moved and passed that a committee of two be appointed to act for the board in the matter of insurance, interest on outstanding bonds and the collection of delinquent dues and other matters of finance that would come under the jurisdiction of an auditing com-

mittee. This committee is composed of W. F. King and C. I. Winnek.

Grammar—Roehler's Modern English Grammar, no diagramming.

Physiology—Graded lessons in physiology and Hygiene—Krohn.

Reading—The teacher will send to the county superintendent the applicant's class standing in reading, which shall be taken by such superintendent as the applicant's standing on the subject.

Spelling—Reed's word lessons.

Writing—Specimens of penmanship as indicated in copied matter and from manuscript in language.
