PURIFYING WATER.

Ozone Found to Be the Best and Cheapest Sterilizing Agent.

Ozone is the best agent for purifying water because it adds nothing except oxygen, which remains in solution, says the Scientific American. An ozonizing plant has recently been installed at St. Maur, near Paris, where the water of the Marne river was found to contain many disease germs, even after it had passed through sedimentation basins and sand filters. The ozone generators are of the Siemens type and are operated by a high tension alternating current obtained by transforming the current of a 110 volt alternator, which is driven by a forty-four horsepower steam engine. The total consumption of energy is one kilowatt hour for each 1,200 cubic feet of water, and more than half of the energy is employed in working the compressing pumps. The cost of sterilization is less than 5 cents per 1,000 cubic feet. The temperature of the water is lowered by the operation, and not a trace of nitrous oxide, chlorine compounds, hydrogen dioxide or metallic salts due to corrosion of the apparatus can be detected in the sterilized water. Of the ozone absorbed 73 per cent is consumed immediately in sterilization, 7 per cent remains diffused through the water and exerts a subsequent sterilizing effect, and 20 per cent escapes into the atmosphere.

Catching Diamonds With Grease.

Until it was discovered that small diamonds could be collected from the debris by the aid of grease the same were lost to the diamond miners. The discovery was the result of an accident, as it might be called. One day a workman started to remove a pile of debris with a shovel that had been used for shoveling grease out of a stock barrel. While at work he noticed small, shiny particles became attached to it, which on examination proved to be very minute diamonds that had escaped the keen eyes of the sorters and been thrown away. The result was the perfection of a grease table over which the mixture of diamonds and stones is fed by a broad, thin stream of water, and as soon as the diamonds touch the grease they adhere to it, while all the ordinary stones, garnets and other material pass over and are washed away. It is remarkable to observe how the grease attracts the diamonds with unerring accuracy, though discarding all else.

Likes Crook County Much Better

C. C. Brix got back last week from a trip of 300 miles into the interior of Canada from a point on the coast near Ashcroft.

Leaving Ashcroft, which has an elevation of about 1050 feet above the level of the sea, he found that the elevation increased to about 4000 feet in forty miles. This general altitude is maintained in all parts of the interior as far as the eye could reach, except three ranges of mountains and occasional valleys, in some of which the elevation was as low as 3000 feet. In the highlands the temperature reaches 60 below zero and that temperature is maintained for six weeks at a time, while further inland the valleys boast of weather almost as mild as Oregon in both winter and summer.
