County Assessor

Busy on Taxroll

County Assessor J. D. LaFollette is busy preparing the work collected by the field deputies for the annual taxroll books, and is working over the lists furnished by the land offices at The Dalles, Burns and Lakeview for the lands that have gone to patent during the fiscal year ending March 1.

From the list of lands that have gone to patent during that period there is an unusually large amount of homestead lands and little or no timber. The homestead lands alone total more than 50,000 acres and the state lands, which include Carey Act lands and other kinds of state land, will reach a total of about 50,000 acres more.

This item alone as nearly as can be estimated will add to the prop-

erty list of the county a total of about a half a million dollars. The increase in values and other items that will add to the total of assessable property will make a total of more than a million dollars and bring the total for the present year to a figure that will be more than \$8,000,000.

Five deputies are at work and the field work is almost completed, excepting the Bend and Redmond districts, which will be finished soon, the delay being caused by lack of deputies.

The work of the assessor's office is doubling every few years and like the other offices of the county, it keeps the incumbent on the jump "to find where he is at." Actual work on the taxroll books will begin about July 1 and continue until completed, which will be in the fall.

To Extinguish Burning Fluids.

The new German method of fighting fire in liquid fuels, like benzine or gasoline, consists in covering the surface with a layer of foam containing an inert gas, thus cutting off the air and making combustion impossible. The approved apparatus made by a Prussian company consists of a simple metal cylinder divided into two chambers and provided with a long spout. One chamber is charged with an aqueous solution of potash, alum and sodium sulphate, the other with a solution of sodium bicarbonate, sodium sulphite and liquorice root extract. As the two cylinders are inclined or reversed the two solutions mix as they issue from the spout, and the chemical reaction between the alum and bicarbonate gives a prompt evolution of carbon dioxide, converting the liquorice solution into an exceedingly stiff and persistent foam. Even when the burning liquid has become so hot that its fiery vapor bubbles up through the foam the carbon dioxide rapidly cools it.

A Huge Water Tank.

The reservoir under construction for the water system of Calcutta, India, is really a great steel tank with a capacity of 9,000,000 imperial gallons. It is 321 feet square, 16 feet deep, and its flat bottom is approximately 91 feet above ground. It is supported on eighty-one steel towers, each approximately twenty feet square, consisting of four vertical columns, properly braced. The tank will be divided into four equal compartments, any one of which may be emptied independently of the others. The roof will be of slate laid on I beams and covered with a waterproofing membrane and then with concrete. The foundation is a concrete slab two and one-half feet thick, covering the entire area and re-enforced with bars and steel I beams beneath the columns.

New Haze Preservative.

Mraslin, a new substance used in Bohemia to coat hams, is said to be as pliable as rubber, tasteless, harmless, easily removed and a perfect preservative.
