

## County Court.

### ADJOURNED TERM.

The adjourned term of the county court met at 10 o'clock a. m., March 20, 1911, at the court room in the courthouse, Prineville, Oregon.

Present—H. C. Ellis, Judge, presiding; R. H. Bayley, commissioner; Warren Brown, county clerk, and T. N. Bahfour, sheriff.

In the matter of the petition of T. W. Taylor et al for county road: the papers having been heretofore submitted to the district attorney and upon his approval thereof, it is ordered that the board of road viewers meet at the beginning of the said proposed road on the 23rd day of April, 1911, view, review and survey said road and report their findings thereon at the next meeting of this court.

In the matter of the petition of George P. Elliott et al for county road: the papers having been heretofore submitted to the district attorney and upon his approval thereof it is ordered that the board of road viewers meet at the beginning of the said proposed road on the 5th day of April, 1911, view, review and survey said road and report their findings thereon at the next meeting of this court.

In the matter of the petition of J. L. Windom et al for county road, the papers having been heretofore submitted to the district attorney and upon his approval thereof it is ordered that the board of road viewers meet at the beginning of the said proposed road on the 7th day of April, 1911, view, review and survey said road and report their findings thereon at the next meeting of this court.

The county clerk is hereby requested to draw a warrant in favor of J. G. Clark, road supervisor of Ashwood district, for the sum of \$100, the same to be accounted for by said Clark at the May meeting of this court.

In the matter of the petition of C. J. Sandquist et al for county road; the papers having been heretofore submitted to the district attorney and upon his approval thereof it is ordered that the board of road viewers meet at the beginning of the said proposed road on the 13th day of April, 1911, view, review and survey said road and report their findings thereon at the next meeting of this court.

In the matter of the petition of C. M. Redfield et al for county road, the papers having been heretofore submitted to the district attorney and upon his approval thereof it is ordered that the board of road viewers meet at the beginning of the said proposed road on the 12th day of April, 1911, view, review and survey said road and report their findings thereon at the next meeting of this court.

In the matter of the petition of C. C. Dunham et al for county road, the papers heretofore having been submitted to the district attorney and upon his approval thereof it is ordered that the board of road viewers meet at the beginning of the said proposed road on the 20th day of April, 1911, view, review and survey said road and report their findings thereon at the next meeting of this court.

And now is presented to this court the plat of Oregon and Western Addition to city of Prineville, accompanied by the tracing thereof, and it appearing to the court that the said plat is not properly executed, it is therefore ordered that upon the executing thereof in conformity to the statute and upon the approval thereof by the county surveyor and county assessor, said plat may be filed in the office of the recorder of deeds and spread of record.

R. L. Brewster presents to the court a plat and tracing thereof and it appearing to the court therefrom that said plat and tracing are not in conformity to law, and that the same are not properly executed, it is therefore ordered that upon the correction of said plat and tracing and the proper execution thereof, together with the approval of the then acting engineer of the city of Prineville, and the approval of the county surveyor and the county assessor, that said plat be accepted and ordered filed for record.

Thereupon court adjourned subject to call.

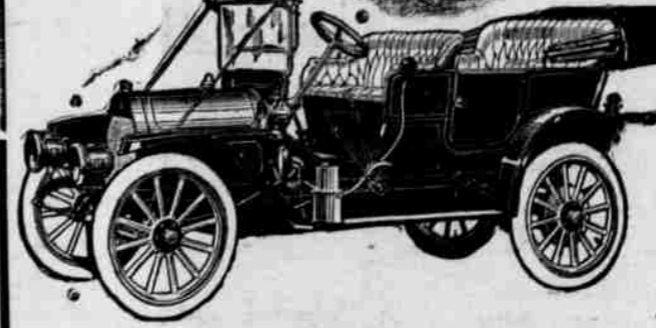
