ADJOURNED TERM

An adjourned term of the county court was held May 29. Present—H. C. Ellis, judge; R. H. Bailey, commissioner, Warren Brown, clerk, and T. N. Balfour, sheriff.

In the matter of the cost of the adjourned session. Whereas this adjourned regular meeting of the county court is held at the special instance and request of the Oregon Trunk Development Co., and inasmuch as the cost and expense of this meeting should not be borne by the taxpayers of Crook county, it is ordered that said company pay to the county clerk the sum of \$75 to defray the expense of this extra term, and that said county clerk pay over said \$75 to the county treasurer for the benefit of the general fund.

Warehouse addition to Madras. 




