Farmers Hit Middlemen.
Gresham.—The farmers of all eastern Multnomah are planning the organization of a produce association and called a meeting at the Commercial Club hall to perfect their plans and elect permanent officers. It is for all producers of farm produce and its purpose is to eliminate the middlemen and commission houses.

Institutes in Eastern Baker.
Baker.—Dr. James Withycombe, head of the experiment station; Professor H. D. Scudder, soil expert; Professor F. L. Kept, of the dairy department of the Oregon Agricultural College, and R. W. Allen, superintendent of the experiment station at Hermiston, have been holding institutes in this district.

Harvesters Are Not Scarce.
Pendleton.—Umatilla county growers of hay and grain are not to be bothered with labor famine troubles this year, according to present indications. Hundreds of idle men are already lining the shady sides of streets "looking for work."

RATES ARE RAISED

Southern Pacific Restores Former Tariffs on Interstate Shipments.

Medford.—Medford merchants are up in arms because of an increase in freight rates from Portland to stations south on the Southern Pacific lines in Oregon upon interstate shipments, as announced by the Southern Pacific.

The new rates are a restoration of old rates in effect prior to February 5, 1911, when the reductions ordered by the State Railroad Commission went into effect. The present rates will be still in effect for state shipments. Heretofore, the interstate rate to Medford and other southern Oregon points has been the rate to Portland from the point of origin plus the local tariff from Portland to the point of destination. Hereafter it is to be the rate to Portland plus the old rate, in Medford's case an average of 20 per cent higher than the present local rate.

When the new tariff goes into effect it will be cheaper to consign merchandise to Portland and rebill it from there to Medford and other points than it will be to consign it directly to Medford.

Students Apologize and Are Reinstated Eugene.—The 100 or more high school students suspended a few days ago for taking part in a "rally" in disobedience to the faculty's orders, have all signed an apology and the order that they will not be allowed to take their final examinations has been rescinded. A special examination will be conducted for them.

Wallowa Forest Sliced.
Wallowa.—Dividing the Wallowa national forest by cutting off 500,000 acres and naming it the Minam National forest, appointing Sherman A. Brown as acting supervisor of the new division and setting July 1 as the date for the change, the Department of Agriculture completes a change contemplated for four years.

MAY SAVE APPROPRIATIONS

Wholesale Fraud in Referendum Petition is Charged.

Enam.—The discovery of wholesale forgeries of names on the referendum petition attacking the validity of Oregon appropriations may yet save these appropriations. Burns' detective, working under the direction of ex-Sheriff Court Justice Slater, declares that 688 names are tainted with fraud and that at least 400 are self-evident forgeries.

Otto Newman, who was indicted in Portland for forging signatures to the Ellis paving petitions, and is now out on bail is named by Slater as being evidently connected with the alleged forgeries. Slater says that there are 50 more under suspicion.

Built Macadam Road.
Medford.—The Clark & Henry Construction Company has been awarded a contract to build an asphalt macadam road between this city and Central Point. The road will be 16 feet wide, the asphalt macadam four inches in thickness, and laid hot. The contract price is \$12,000 a mile.

The Dalles.—An excursion of The Dalles business men who desire to see the newly opened central Oregon country and become acquainted with conditions existing there will leave here June 23.
