

County Court, September Term.

(Continued from last week.)

Application by Steidl & Tweet to blast in Deschutes river. Petition dated Aug. 9, 1911, asking for a thirty day permit to blast and remove certain rocks for a channel for the escape of water from a turbine wheel, duly approved by S. G.
