

## Knights of Pythias Enjoy Big Banquet

Upon the occasion of the arrival last night of Grand Chancellor Commander Frank T. Wrightman and Grand Keeper of the Records and Seal Lou R. Stinson of Salem, the local lodge of Knights of Pythias entertained at the Oregon Grill with a banquet the equal of which has never been attained in Prineville. About 50 cover were laid and so elaborate was the spread prepared by the Oregon Hotel management that the courses were not yet completed at 2 o'clock this morning.

A great many friends of the local lodge were present as well as the members themselves and visiting Pythians. Before the banquet a short meeting was held in the lodgeroom where the visiting moguls were given an opportunity to meet the Prineville members. Short talks were indulged in at the lodge meeting so that consequently the toasts at the banquet were short.

Dr. J. H. Rosenberg acted as toastmaster. He introduced both Mr. Wrightman and Mr. Stinson who made a few remarks touching upon the principles and endeavors of the Knights of Pythias, giving a short history of the organization since its inception by Justus H. Rathbone in 1864 and telling what its purposes and aims were. It was Mr. Stinson's first visit to Prineville and he was much impressed with entertainment and the hospitality shown.

Toasts were also responded to by H. C. Davis, who gave a short description of his visit to the grand lodge meeting at Astoria last spring with Mr. Ada Foster. Collins W. Elkins responded to the toast of "Prineville" and endeavored to give the visiting brethren some idea of the growth and development of the metropolis of interior Oregon.

Mr. Wrightman and Mr. Stinson came yesterday from Grant county. They are making their annual inspection and visit to the lodges in this domain, which includes all the state of Oregon and will leave for Bend this evening where their next visit will take place.

## Horace Stricklin Taken to Asylum

Horace Stricklin, a sheepherder for Kuhn on Beaver creek, was adjudged insane by Dr. Belknap. Stricklin was brought in last Friday and confined in a cell used by female prisoners. It is not enclosed in the big steel cage and is lathed and plastered. Stricklin

was not long in finding this out for he used his heavy herding boots in trying to break his way out. He ripped the plastering off the walls, took the door lock apart and finally tried to break up the cement floor. At times Sheriff Balfour says the man would get down on all fours and bark like a dog. He was taken to the asylum the first of the week by an attendant from that institution.
