the assessors' convention at Salem. He will notify his constituency on his return.

Mr. Ford will be a candidate to succeed himself for the office of school superintendent. We understand that he is to have opposition in the republican nomination. So far no announcements have been made.

C. D. Brown of Bend will seek the republican nomination for the office of sheriff at the April primaries. Mr. Brown is the night custodian of law aid at Bend.

Addie Foster is being urged by his friends to enter the race for county assessor. He hasn't decided whether he will or not.

Wesley O. Smith, editor and publisher of the Evening Herald at Klamath Falls, has announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination as state representative. The legislative district includes Crook, Klamath, Lake and Grant counties. We understand Attorney Forbes of Bend intends to make the race. So far Grant county has no announced candidate.

## Additional Details of Schaffer Killing

The LaPine Intermountain furnishes additional information concerning the killing of Schaffer. It says: "Because he resisted arrest by deputy sheriffs of Lake county, J. E. Schaffer, a well known rancher and land locator, was shot at his ranch home, nine miles southeast of Fort Rock, Monday afternoon. Death occurred about 9 o'clock Monday.

The warrant for Schaffer's arrest was sworn out on complaint of R. M. Smith, an Indiana farmer, who, in company with several other landseekers, passed through La Pine five days ago, at Silver Lake, Monday. Smith engaged Schaffer to locate him on a homestead near Fort Rock and, after looking over the land for two days, stated it did not suit him. After demanding and receiving \$50 for his trouble, Schaffer, who had an ungovernable temper, gave Smith a fearful beating, dragging the insensible man from the house to the side of the road near by, where he was picked up by neighbors shortly afterwards and driven to Silver Lake for medical attendance. The doctor's examination disclosed that two of Smith's ribs were broken, his face had been beaten beyond all recognition, and his body was a mass of bruises from one end to the other. It is feared there are some internal injuries. The warrant was given to Deputy Sheriff P. D. Reeder, of Silver Lake, for serving, and because Schaffer had resisted arrest two different occasions before, D. W. Jones and C. Buick were sworn in as deputies. The men reached the Schaffer ranch Monday afternoon, the big German coming to the door with a rifle in one of his hands, just as they appeared in the yard. One of the deputies got the drop on him and he was told to drop his rifle. He refused and was shot twice, both bullets piercing the chest just below the right lung. The coroner reached the ranch from Lakeview yesterday. Interment occurred today.

C. E. Schaffer had been the terror of his neighborhood for two years. He was a man about 40 years old, over 6 feet tall, and had broad shoulders and immense strength. In spite of his unsavory reputation and quarrelsome disposition, he possessed magnetic qualities that drew nearly everyone to him. He was quite generally known in La Pine and vicinity, and while not a member of the rifle club organized here three months ago, he was present at both the shoots given by the club—Thanksgiving day and the Saturday before Christmas. He was an excellent rifle shot and carried off more than his share of the prizes at the two events. The day of the Christmas shoot was his last visit to La Pine.

## Death of Mrs. Ellefson.

Mrs. O. L. Ellefson died Saturday afternoon at her home in this city following an operation for peritonitis, at the age of 23 years, four months and 20 days. She was sick only a few days, her illness beginning the previous Tuesday.

Nellie Ewing Ellefson was born at Spanish Gulch, Grant County, on the 20th of September, 1888. She was the fourth daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Ewing. She was married to Ollie L. Ellefson on the 21st of February, 1906. To this union two children were born, Olive, aged four years, and Arthur, aged two years. She died February 10, 1912.

During Dr. Bulgin's meetings she professed faith in Christ but did not identify herself with any church.

Mrs. Ellefson leaves to mourn her untimely death a loving husband, two children, a devoted mother, sister and six brothers, besides other relatives and a host of kind and loving friends.

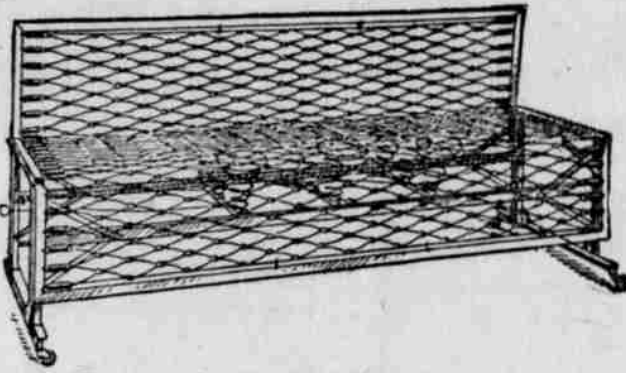
