

County Court Adjourned Term

An adjourned term of the County Court for January was held on March 6.

In the matter of bridges across Crooked and Deschutes rivers. Now on this day comes the matter of the construction of bridges across the Deschutes and Crooked rivers, and it appearing to the Court that the building of said bridges and the spending of the Robert E. Jordan county road are emergency matters, and

It further appearing to the Court that it is for the best interest of the public that said bridges be constructed in a first-class manner and that they be of a permanent nature, and the Court having heretofore made full inquiry into the matter of prices and styles of bridges, abutments, etc., it is therefore deemed by the Court advisable to forthwith enter into a contract under the provisions of Sec. 6338 of L. O. L., to this extent; that said county forthwith contract for the necessary material for the construction of each of said bridges; that the County Court shall inspect all material as to its fitness; that said Court shall inspect all bills for said materials and for the labor necessary in erecting said bridges, and to this end it is

Ordered by the Court that a contract be entered into by the County Court of Crook county and the Coast Bridge Company, an Oregon corporation, for such bridges, which contract, among other things, shall call for all metal material fabricated ready for the erection of two low-truss bridges, each bridge to be 100 feet long and 16 feet in width, for the sum of \$2500 each, provided said Coast Bridge Company shall furnish a surety bond in the sum of \$5000, guaranteeing the furnishing of said materials according to said contract, plans, strain sheet and specifications thereto attached and made a part thereof, and it is

Ordered that said contract further provide for the labor of erecting said bridges at the actual cost to Crook county for labor necessary for the erection and completion of said bridges, provided said bridge company shall furnish a further surety bond guaranteeing that in no event will such cost exceed the sum of \$3000 for the erection and completion of each of said bridges.

It is further ordered that the written specifications consisting of six typewritten pages for the materials used in said bridges and the details for the erection thereof, based upon the hand book of the Carnegie Steel Company, together with the blue print of said proposed bridges, the strain sheet and the surety bond executed by the National Surety Company in favor of said Crook county in the penal sum of \$5,000, guaranteeing the furnishing of all material fabricated, as provided in said contract and with a further surety bond executed by the National Surety Company in favor of said Crook County in the penal sum of \$900, guaranteeing the erection of the said two bridges, as more particularly set forth in said above contract, which said specifications, blue print, strain sheet and bonds are attached to and made a part of said contract and they are ordered filed with the County Clerk of this Court for public reference and inspection.

And it is further ordered that G. E. Woodward, civil and bridge engineer of said Crook County, State of Oregon, be and is hereby employed as superintendent of and for said bridges; that said superintendent shall inspect all material, as to its fitness, and shall inspect all bills for material and labor and certify to their correctness, before they shall be ordered paid by said court and upon the completion of said bridge, shall prepare and file with the clerk of said court, a full and complete detailed statement, duly verified, giving the name of the stream across which said bridge is built, the name or location of said bridge in such a manner that it may easily be found, its entire length, width, amount and cost of such kind of material and entire cost of said bridge, with a brief general description of the style and character of said bridge and of its immediate surroundings, as in such cases made and provided by statutes of the state of Oregon.

In the matter of a private change in the Prineville-Dalles road by J. E. Adamson et al. Inasmuch as said change does not increase the distance nor the gradients to the injury of the traveling public said change is recommended by the board. It is therefore ordered that said road be and the same is hereby declared a public highway.

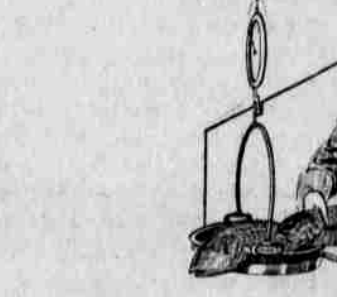
