

The national Prohibition convention was held in Atlantic City, N. J. American athletes triumphed at the Olympic games in Stockholm. Pat McDonald broke the world's record for the shotput with a heave of 50 feet 4 inches, and Meredith, a school-boy, created a new world's record when he ran 800 meters in 1 minute 59 9-10 seconds. William F. McCombs was offered the 77 75 Ut the Week management of the Wilson campaign, and Charles D. Hilles was chosen to take charge of the Taft forces. The United States 120 00 senate decided the case of William Lorimer of Illinois. The house voted to impeach Judge Robert W. Archbald.
