Special Premium and Livestock Winners

The special premium list at the fair this year deserves more than a casual notice. There were prizes offered that brought out lots of good-natured rivalry and in which competition was usually keen. We take pleasure this week in presenting the names of the donors and the winners of the prizes.

We are also publishing this week the list of prize-winners in the stock division.

Special Premiums.

E. T. Slayton was awarded the first premium for the best farm exhibit. He had 107 different varieties of farm products.

The silver cup for the best bushel of wheat, donated by the O. W. R. & N. Co., was won by Mrs. H. J. Healy of Culver.

Reaves Wilcox won the cash premium of \$10 offered by the First National Bank of Prineville for the best bushel of wheat, any variety. He also won the \$10 special offered by the Prineville Flouring Mills for best bushel of Bluestem.

N. F. McCain took first for the best bushel of Galgatus wheat and first for the best bushel of Fortyfold.

S. D. Mustard took first for the best bushel of potatoes, any variety, irrigated or dry land. He received \$25 from the fair association and the W. F. King Co.'s special which consisted of a hand garden seeder and cultivator, valued at \$16.

Mr. Wright of Redmond won the Clifton & Cornett special for best pen of Plymouth Rock chickens.

R. H. Shriver of Prineville won the Foster & Hyde special for best pen of Orpingtons.

D. P. Adamson won his own special prize for the best pen of White Wyandottes.

C. O. Pollard won the J. H. Templeton special for best pen of Leghorns.

Ed Slayton won the \$10 offered by the Prineville real estate dealers for the best display grains in stock.

John Kemmling won the H. D. Still prize for the best Jersey cow.

M. M. Davenport of Redmond won the Prineville Cigar Factory special for the best display of watermelons.

A. J. Noble won the \$10 offered by the Pioneer Creamery for the best one-day test for milk cows.

W. G. Mustard of Powell Butte took the Prineville Furniture Exchange \$12 rocker for the best 25 pounds of onions.

F. G. Atkinson of Redmond won Mrs. I. Michel's prize for the best three heads of cabbage.

Ed Slayton won Geo. White's special for the best case of honey.

The Ochoco Valley Mining Co. won the Pioneer Tel. & Tel. Co.'s cash prize for the best display of Crook county minerals.

Mrs. W. S. Ayers won the Winnek prize for the best ten pounds of butter and also the De Laval Dairy Supply Co.'s special prize.

District Court—Special Term December 9

Circuit court adjourned Monday. The grand jury last week reported eleven true bills and three not true bills.

True bills were found against V. M., Al and Wm. L. Robertson, and George Kentner for horse stealing. Al Robertson and Kentner have not been apprehended. The others are in the county jail.

These men shipped three carloads of horses out of Bend last August to points in Washington, Idaho and Montana. George H. Russell, Bill Brown and Gus Schroder got wind of the shipment and located eighteen of their horses at Toppenish, Wash. The brands were tampered with, it is alleged, but the horses were identified. The defendants asked for a continuance of their case which was granted by the court. The time set for hearing is December 9. Each defendant is under \$5000 bonds.

Judd McPherson and Dick Garret were indicted by the grand jury for stealing cattle alleged to be the property of H. L. Friday and W. W. Brown. This case was continued from the last grand jury. Garret, it will be remembered, was out of the penitentiary on parole when he and McPherson took the cattle. Garret has been sent back to the pen but McPherson has not been caught.

H. F. Jones was indicted for gambling. His case was continued until the next term. The appealed case against him was dismissed for the reason that the justice court tried him without jurisdiction.

E. C. Myers pleaded guilty to conducting a bawdy house at Bend. He was sentenced to pay a fine of \$150.

Two indictments were found against David R. Dunn for selling liquor without a license at Last Chance. He pleaded guilty and was fined \$250.

Carlos Lawson of Bend was indicted for murder in the first degree by the grand jury. He was tried and found guilty of manslaughter. The court gave him an indeterminate sentence of from one to fifteen years in the penitentiary.

Lawson killed Mrs. Carrie Patterson in a rooming house at Bend last May. He in turn, was shot in the shoulder by T. H. Jones just after Lawson had shot Mrs. Patterson. James Rogers was indicted for forgery. He is the man that passed the \$25 check on Frank Brosius signed by Dick Shriver. He was given an indeterminate

sentence of from two to twenty years.

J. H. O'Kelly of Culver was indicted by the grand jury on a charge of rape against his 14-year-old daughter. After a jury trial he was found not guilty.

The grand jury found not true bills against T. H. Jones of Bend, charged with assault with a deadly weapon; H. T. King of Culver charged with rape against his stepdaughter; and Frank Dalton, charged with running a bawdy house at Bend.
