Hybrid Wheat Chokes "Jim Hill" Mutards

According to the Oregonian of July 24, a Umatilla county farmer declares he has found a positive cure for the "Jim Hill" mutard which has proved a pest to the farmers of the Inland Empire during the past ten years.

Mr. Tulloch planted a hybrid wheat and found that early in the season the mutard had almost entirely disappeared. A neighbor who planted some of the same wheat had a similar experience.

This weed appeared in Crook county a few years ago, and while it is not widely distributed any method of destroying it should receive the immediate attention of the farmers. If the weed could be cut now before the seed ripens much damage would be saved to future crops.

Interesting Programs at Lyric Theatre

An appreciative audience attended the Lyric Theatre Monday and Tuesday evening to see the first of the "Mary" series of pictures, which were produced in collaboration with the Ladies' World.

Death of Mr. Thronson

Columbia and Caroline Thronson received the sad intelligence of their father's death Friday of last week. Mr. Thronson died at the residence of his brother, Chas. Thronson, near Dayton, Washington, Tuesday, July 22d.

During the last six months he had been bedridden the greater part of the time, his trouble being indigestion. He suffered a great deal, but was patient and uncomplaining. He was 54 years, ten months and ten days of age.

The funeral was held from the Keystone Farm, Thursday evening at 4 p. m., and interment was made in the Evergreen cemetery, Covells, Washington.

Mr. Thronson formerly resided in Prineville, and was engaged in various mining enterprises in this state and Washington. He was a member of the Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of this city.

Mr. Thronson is survived by two brothers, Charles and J. A. Thronson; a sister, Mattie Riggs; a daughter, Mrs. Anna Frary, of Dayton, Wash.; a son, Thron, Jr., residing in Portland, and two daughters, Columbia and Carolina, who reside with their mother, Mrs. Henry Cram, of this city.

HEALTH HINT FOR TODAY.

Increased Weight at Middle Age.
The gain in weight that is so common between the ages of thirty-five and forty-five is never beneficial. As a rule, it is not an indication of improved nutrition, but of a weakening of the eliminating functions, which allows of the increase in weight. At this period the weight should be rather decreased than allowed to increase, especially in women, and this should be done by exercise rather than by change in diet. But if weight increases persistently the tendency should be overcome by fasting from two to ten days periodically. This will avoid many of the common diseases that appear at this time, especially in women, and obviate the necessity for many operations.

HEALTH HINT FOR TODAY.

Heartburn.
Heartburn is due to hyperacidity or excess of acid secretion in the stomach. This interferes with digestion by preventing the proper digestion of starch, and in this condition acid foods and sugar are especially irritating. It can be relieved, but not corrected, by the use of alkaline drugs. Carbonate of soda and similar remedies may be taken for temporary relief. Acid foods should be avoided. Baked potato is alkaline and is usually acceptable in such cases. The food should be thoroughly mixed with saliva and should be confined for a time to stale bread, potatoes and a small amount of beans in some cases. The mental state is frequently an important factor in the cause and correction of the malady, but lack of proper exercise is the principal cause. Systematic exercise, including walking, should be adopted gradually and followed regularly. The simpler the diet the better.
